St. Jude Council #11293 of the Knights of Columbus is located at St. Jude Catholic Church in Allen, TX. The Council was chartered on April 1, 1994, through the dedication and work of 32 men of our Parish. The Council is named after the Apostle St. Jude, also known as Thaddaeus, who was a brother of St. James the Less, and a relative of Our Savior. St. Jude Thaddeus is invoked in desperate situations because his New Testament letter stresses that the faithful should persevere in the environment of harsh, difficult circumstances, just as their forefathers had done before them; therefore, he is the Patron Saint of desperate cases and lost causes. The Knights of Columbus cornerstones are Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.

Important Point – For most, if not all Council events, <u>families</u> are encouraged to attend.

1. Take the Ministry Safe, Sexual Abuse Awareness Training Program Course. Requirement: You must be Safe Environment trained to be able to participate in events where children are present. You must be cleared through the Diocese Safe Environment training requirement and have a background check performed. Both must be completed to be cleared. Your initial training session is with Gail Moaleu, our St. Jude (SJ) Safe Environment Coordinator, if you haven't been cleared previously.
